CEO MESSAGE

2019 was a pivotal year for Girls Inc. of Greater Houston. Thanks to the overwhelming generous support of two grantors who awarded us with multi-year grants totaling in excess of \$350K, our sold out record breaking Annual Strong, Smart & Bold Breakfast raising a record \$254K, as well as many other generous supporters. The organization is now poised for growth and expansion throughout the Greater Houston area.

During 2019, we provided our programming in-school and after-school to over 550 girls ages 6 -18 years old at 22 sites within the Houston and Aldine Independent School Districts as well as Chinquapin Preparatory School in Highland, TX; representing a 20% increase from 2018. Additionally, we piloted a couple of new programs: CompuGirls spring camp with a focus on coding and social justice; and we introduced a new high school program, Bold LeadHERS Initiative in the 5th Ward.

Girls Inc. of Greater Houston continues to be the only all girl program within the Greater Houston area that offers a research-based comprehensive and consistent curriculum to girls in 1st – 12th grade, engages area schools as program partners, and targets the highest-need and most at-risk communities. We work collaboratively to build, develop, and sustain partnerships with other non-profits to focus on the “whole” girl and enrich their lives with complementing programs and activities.

2019 marked the beginning of our journey as we looked to expand our reach to over 1,000 girls over the next three years and continue to inspire ALL girls to be Strong, Smart and Bold. We present this report to share with you our growth, determination and successes. We hope that you continue to support our journey. Thank you for your steadfast support and making a difference in the lives of girls!




